#### 2015 PASTORAL LETTER

Dear Disciples of Good Shepherd ~

The accomplishments and endeavors of 2015 have left their mark on our history as an active and vital congregation. As I watched the recent Star Wars movie that opened in 2015 it took me back to 1977 when the first of the Star Wars series debuted. There is much talk about the Force as a modern form of theology for a growing number of people who will never cross the threshold of a church. This theology has little to do with a personal relationship with the "Force" that creates us ~ who we call God or Father~ and is simply no more than a power source. As I do agree that there is a powerful force in our nature, that Force has given us the choice to make it personal or remote. My hope is that we might look at the opportunities ahead of us in 2016 as a time to make our relationship with God a more personal experience by participating in the ministries that Good Shepherd supports in various ways.

I see this message each year as an opportunity to inspire the followers of Christ to begin or continue the quest to bring the Realm of God closer as we journey toward that heavenly home which Jesus has promised that God has prepared for us. I've made reference to movies in last year's Annual Report and I have made the Star Wars reference this year which leads me to wonder, what type of movie would be made if it was about Good Shepherd. Would it be a comedy? A tragedy? A drama? A documentary? Or perhaps a new category of altruism and compassion, support and affirmations in a series of vignettes. Who would be the director and who would be the lead and who would be the antagonist if there was an antagonist? Who would be the supporting actors and actresses in the unfolding saga? My prayer has and will always be that God is the director of the events in the life of Good Shepherd and we all take heed from God's direction. That Jesus Christ is the lead with each and every one of us as best supporting actors and actresses. That the Holy Spirit would guide us in times of uncertainty and motivate us to accomplish great things that touch the heart and soul of others in 2016 and future generations.

Looking over the past year allows us to prepare our roles for 2016. A major observation always seems to be financial, but I see a more serious issue in the declining attendance. It causes concern and doubt to the ministry and mission placed before us. We as sponsors of this make believe movie need to address this ominous issue. One thing we can do is realize that our own participation and presence is essential. That our inviting others to join us on Sunday mornings is paramount. That being welcoming and showing hospitality by our supportive and kind gestures mean that others will continue as best they can as they are able. That we recognize that even the least of us has a special place in the heart of God in the personal relationships we are called to create with one another and with God. That the Force is within us to do good and not harm, to love and not become apathetic.

May God bless us on Oscar night that we are not just nominated but that we win Best Picture to the glory of God and the blessings of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.







#### **2015 LITTLE SHEPHERD'S PRESCHOOL**

Little Shepherd's Preschool began this year in early September and ends in May. We offer a well-rounded curriculum including arts and crafts, fine motor skills, musical activities, self-selection, snack time, finger plays, language skills, physical activities, pre-reading skills and pre-math skills. All of these skills are incorporated into monthly themes that are child-centered and age appropriate.

We offer classes for both 3 and 4 year old children. Our 3's class runs on Mondays and Thursdays from 9-11. Our 4's class runs on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays with a few different options for parents. We offer a 9-11:30 class, a 9-1:00 class and a 9-2:30 class. The children get use to a longer day before entering kindergarten the following year.

Each month throughout the year the parents receive a calendar and newsletter letting them know which skills we will be working on throughout the month. Each month we have a different theme as well as letter, color, shape and number. Throughout the day, the children do a variety of activities which encourage social, emotional, and creative growth and the development of the child as a whole.

We offer various programs and field trips throughout the year. In October we went to Troxell's Farm, we had a Halloween program and parade for parents. At Christmas time, we had a program for parents and a special visit from Santa. In the Spring we have an Easter Egg hunt, a Mother's Day Tea and graduation programs for all classes.

Early Childhood should be a time of fun, warmth, security, exploring and discovery. The staff here at Little Shepherd's Preschool strives to nurture and encourage these qualities in the children who attend.

- On May 23, 2015 went bowling at Haja Lanes in Palmerton with 5 youth, 1 baby and 4 adults joining in the fun and fellowship.
- On August 8, 2015 at the Good Shepherd had a carwash netting \$271.00 to help with expenses for the congregation.
- On September 12, 2015 gathered at in the Fellowship Kitchen to bake for the youth bake sale at Kmart on September 13, 2015 with the fund raiser netting \$362.10 which the youth earmarked for the paying of bills for the congregation.
- August through September the Youth Fellowship had a Sixth Street Shelter Drive collecting 3 sets of bed sheets, 10 plastic plates, 14 plastic bowls, 4 big plastic drinking glasses, 6 plastic cups, 2 spoons and 2 forks.
- The youth held a new fundraiser handing out small tubes of mini M&Ms to the congregation asking for a donation in return ~ either filling up the container with quarters, dollars or checks made out to Good Shepherd UCC. These funds were designated for the Heifer Project to purchase a goat for a family in Africa. They raised over \$1,000 and so they purchased a milk menagerie.
- On November 1, 2015 thirteen youth gathered and prepared a service that was youth focused for November 8, 2015 with plans to continue creating a youthful service during the 11:00am service as a way to reach more youth in the community

In 2016 the Youth hope to increase the number of participants in 'Soup'er Bowl Sunday and to sponsor the 2016 Confirmands' Valentine Candy Sale by purchasing the chocolate bars for the class.

Altar Guild duties include maintaining the Candles, Parmanents and Altar cloths, Cross Cloths, Totenfest Candle Stand, Harvest Home, Flower and Bulletin Charts, Assisting Acolytes, Ordering Altar Flower Arrangements, Palms, Baptism Roses, Easter Flowers, Geraniums and Christmas Poinsettias.

There were 27 sponsors for Altar Flowers for Church Services this year. The Altar Guild is also responsible for setting up the Harvest Home display in September, and all food collected goes to the Northern Lehigh Food Bank. There was 1,379 lbs. of food donated to Northern Lehigh Food Bank for 2015 Harvest Home.

The price of Altar flowers is \$25.00 for year 2015 and staying the same for the 2016 church year. The bulletins are \$10.00 and staying the same price for the 2016 church year. A dish garden arrangement was used for midweek Lenten services as in the past. Altar flowers are ordered for 52 Sundays a year, plus six special services, for a total of 58 arrangements a year. Altar flowers are supplied by Kerns Florist located in Slatington.

The Easter Flowers, Geraniums and Poinsettias are ordered from Hickory Grove Greenhouse in Catasauqua. The total amount for Poinsettias was \$180.00. All 18 Candelabras flowers for Christmas Eve services were purchased at a price of \$17.50 which gives a profit of \$135.00. The only profit Altar Guild makes is on the Candelabra flowers. All other flower orders are at cost.

- collected 359 cans of corn for the Easter meals
- June is Good Shepherd's month to collect items for the soap closet and collected 43 pounds of soap products, toothpaste, toothbrushes, toilet tissue, laundry detergent and misc. items were collected
- July is our month to volunteer to distribute food which consists of one Thursday night and one Saturday morning. Thank you to everyone who came out to help.
- Harvest Home was held in September at Good Shepherd and a total of 157 pounds of assorted foods were donated
- In November Good Shepherd donated 300 cans of corn for the Thanksgiving meals
- December, the Food Bank distributed Christmas dinners and Good Shepherd donated 389 cans of corn for those meals.

Tickets are sold for a 50/50 drawing, the club receives half of the sale of tickets and two 25/25 drawings are divided between two members.

Refreshments are served at meetings, and cards and bingo are played. Ham sandwiches are made and sold at meetings.
