The coordinator utilizes various media outlets including print, radio, television, the Internet, as well as other means deemed appropriate.

Throughout 2016, Good Shepherd's webmaster, Stephen Haas, has been busy updating the church's website. Our website has continued posting the monthly newsletters, which can be viewed online as PDFs or printed. To reach out to the congregation and community, ChurchPost is integrated into our website, allowing anyone with an e-mail address to directly sign-up and receive ChurchPost notifications.

The website is always a work-in-progress; and continued to be updated in 2016. # **2016 Altar Guild Committee Report**

Altar Guild duties include maintaining the Candles, Parmanents and Altar cloths, Cross Cloths, Totenfest Candle Stand, Harvest Home, Flower and Bulletin Charts, Assisting Acolytes, Ordering Altar Flower Arrangements, Palms, Baptism Roses, Easter Flowers, Geraniums and Christmas Poinsettias. There were 25 sponsors for Altar Flowers for Church Services this year. Also, 25 orders for Easter Flowers, 7 Geraniums ordered for Pentecost, 25 Poinsettias ordered for Christmas Eve Services and 18 candelabra's were sponsored. The bulletins were sponsored for 9 Church Services. The Altar Guild is also responsible for setting up the Harvest Home display in September, and all food collected goes to the Northern Lehigh Food Bank.

The price of Altar flowers is \$25.00 for year 2016 and staying the same for the 2017 church year. The bulletins are \$10.00 and staying the same price for the 2017 church year. A dish garden arrangement was used for midweek Lenten services as in the past. Altar flowers are available to be sponsored for 52 Sundays a year, plus six special services, for a total of 58 arrangements a year. Altar flowers are supplied by My Meadow's Creations. The Easter Flowers, Geraniums and Poinsettias are ordered from Hickory Grove Greenhouse in Catasauqua.

Mitten Tree – The mitten tree was placed in the narthex for the collection of hats, scarves, gloves, mittens, etc. We collected 8 pairs of women's gloves, 6 pairs of men's gloves, 15 scarves, 1 children's glove and hat set, 11 pairs of children's gloves, and 17 children's hats. These items were donated to the Sixth Street Shelter and Allentown Rescue Mission.

Hanging of the Greens – On Nov 27<sup>th</sup> we celebrated the beginning of the Advent season during an 10:00 am service. Snowflake ornaments were handed to each person entering the church to be placed on the Christmas tree which was donated by the Kevin Minnich family. This year our theme was "Teach the Children" during which Saint Nicholas was telling us that our children should be taught the real meaning of Christmas. The confirmands assisted in the program as well as speakers, Bob Koons, Christie Bilheimer, and Tammy White. We also had special music by Logan Bachman performing "Mary Did You Know". Small filled children's gift boxes were again carried forward by our children which were then donated to the Northern Lehigh Food Bank. The committee did prior decorating on Saturday Nov 26<sup>th</sup>.

# 2016 Hand Bell Choir

Good Shepherd's Hand Bell Choir had a wonderful year. The Bell Choir started rehearsing in October of 2015 with eight members. That group played until May 2016. They re-organized in October 2016 with 8 members. The Choir is under the direction of Michele Hunsicker.

The Kristal Bell Method is a totally original hand bell playing system. It allows the choir to produce beautiful hand bell music accompanied by fully orchestrated song arrangements recorded on compact discs. The unique aspect of this method is that no musical knowledge is necessary on the part of the hand bell players. A director or facilitator is needed to lead the hand bell players and to coordinate the bell playing with the recorded music.

#### **Christian Education Annual Report**

The committee held 10 meetings, one per month on the third Wednesday of each month, with the exception of July and December.

In February, there was a Youthful worship service, Boy Scout and Girl Scout Sunday combined service and the youth collected 119 cans of soup and 17 boxes of crackers. The preschool also helped in this endeavor. In addition to the soup drive which benefitted the Northern Lehigh Food Bank, the youth collected \$ 105 for the Allentown Soup Kitchen.

In March, the Sunday School held an Easter Pageant on Palm Sunday, did egg coloring for the egg hunt which was held on March 26. In the midst of the Easter happenings, the youth did another Youthful Worship on Good Friday with 10 children reading, and 6 or 7 other children helping with greeting, handing out bulletins and other light "duties".

In May, the confirmation class was confirmed. Promotion Sunday was held on May 29th.

In June, the high school graduates and college graduates were honored. Another Youthful worship was held at the end of the month on June 26<sup>th</sup>.

In September, we held Rally Day with the Slatedale Fire Company, who showed the children/youth some ways they can keep themselves safe when confronted with a fire. Also, we had homemade ice cream and made sundaes.

October was busy with the Blessing of the Animals at the beginning of Sunday School class. Pastor James blessed 12 dogs. The confirmands did pumpkin decorating for the congregation to vote on, and help raise funds for the confirmation class. At the end of the month, was Trunk or Treat, where we had 10 trunks that the children could come in costume and "visit" each trunk for a treat. Refreshments of hotdogs and drinks were served in the Fellowship Hall.

The Christian Ed department also participated in the Adopt-A-Child program to benefit the children from the Northern Lehigh Food Bank along with the Northern Lehigh Pastoral Association. 24 gifts were received from the congregation to be distributed in December.

In December, the youth/confirmands decorated gingerbread houses, made baskets for the homebound and delivered them while caroling on December 3<sup>rd</sup>. There was another Youthful worship held on the 18<sup>th</sup>, in which the confirmands participated in the service. The confirmands also held a fundraiser to benefit the church, and that was selling SUBWAY coupons. The profit for the coupons was \$ 178.00.

The Scrip program, managed by Monica Griffith, had a profit of \$ 3,497.62 for the year 2016.

# 2016 NORTHERN LEHIGH FOOD BANK

The food that is distributed is donated, purchased or picked up at 2<sup>nd</sup> Harvest Food Bank. On average per month, 233 families were served for 2016.

# For the year 2016, Good Shepherd has contributed to the Food Bank in the following ways:

For Souper Bowl Sunday we collected 119 cans of soup, and 17 boxes of crackers, for a grand total of 110 pounds.

We collected 376 cans of corn for the Easter meals and ten pounds of assorted food. Thank you to the ten people who helped distribute the Easter meals.

The month of June is Good Shepherd's month to collect items for the soap closet. We collected over 50 pounds of soap products, toothpaste, toothbrushes, toilet tissue, laundry detergent and misc. items. July is our month to volunteer to distribute food which consists of one Thursday night and one Saturday morning. Thank you to everyone who came out to help.

Harvest Home was held in September at Good Shepherd and a total of 220 pounds of assorted foods were donated. The children of the Sunday school also donated their vegetables they grow at the church. In the month of November Good Shepherd donated 233 cans of corn for the Thanksgiving meals. Also, in the month of December, the Food Bank distributed Christmas dinners. Good Shepherd donated 262 cans of corn for those meals.

Through the Northern Lehigh Pastoral Association and the Northern Lehigh Food Bank, the church members adopted eight children for the adopt a child Christmas program. Each child received three gifts.

For the year 2016, 1,261 pounds of food and products were donated to the Northern Lehigh Food Bank.
