Dear family and friends of Good Shepherd ~

I am moved by the possibilities we have at Good Shepherd United Church of Christ. Possibilities of becoming whole and healthy, the possibilities of ministry and mission, the possibilities of being a reflection of Christ to a world longing for miracles and recognizing God in our midst. It hasn't been too long since we celebrated the birth of Emanuel 'God-with-us' and my prayers are for God to be seen in our actions, our speech, our very essence.

Attending the Interfaith Prayer Breakfast hosted by the Lehigh Conference of Churches I was reminded that Martin Luther King, Jr. was only 39 when he died 52 years ago and that just before he was killed he was planning a Poor People's March on Washington to gain economic justice for the poor people in the United States regardless of the color of a person's skin or ethnic heritage or genetic makeup. It was a call of a moral nature to fulfill God's command to care for our sisters and brothers and not leave anyone behind. That he would have been 90 years old this year. We were asked how things might have been different had his life not been ended so soon by an assassin's bullet.

As we move into this new year our Conference is going to lift up different faith traditions we at Good Shepherd are going to add our voice as we celebrate our Lenten Gatherings with Interfaith Journey's as we did a number of years ago, we will be inviting people of different faith traditions to break bread with us. The Spring Conference Meeting April 24th and 25th at Camelback will include similar experiences. In addition to these opportunities,

Since 1982, we've partnered with Catholic Charities to ensure that the working poor, homeless, elderly, children, those between jobs, individuals on fixed incomes, and those who have nowhere else to turn receive at least one hot, nutritious meal every day of the week. The LCC's kitchen operates three days a week; Catholic Charities', four. Medical care is made available on a weekly basis by the LVHN Street Medicine Team and Sacred Heart Parish Nurses, who offer free screenings, referrals for follow up care, and assistance with health insurance enrollment.
