



Keystone Conference ~ Together We Are Stronger

November 9, 2024 marks an historic date in the life of our Church. On this date, all four conferences that comprise the

Commonwealth of Pennsylvania simultaneously voted on merging together to become one Conference. The vote was as follows:

a) PWC: 135 YES; 15 NO = 90%

b) PCC: 286 YES; 28 NO = 91%

c) PNEC: 141 YES; 2 NO = 98.6%

d) PSEC: 246 YES; 19 NO = 92%

The next step in the process to form this new Keystone Conference will be a resolution submitted to the General Synod of the United Church of Christ which meets in Kansas City, MO July 11-15, 2025.

Following the affirmation of General Synod for us to become the Keystone Conference, PNEC will no longer be a conference acting as an association but will instead become an association of the Keystone Conference. There will be a need of volunteers from clergy and laity to continue the various duties we are already serving as an association, but no longer as a conference. This new association will involve some expenses including some

administrative costs, mailings, etc. and supplement the scholarship resources that will support pastors, continuing education, youth programming and authorization preparation. These expenses will be supported both by the conference and by the association, which can include fees for programs and events, as well as the Friends of the PNEC resources.

Again, with the creation of the Keystone Conference, monies collected through Our Churches Wider Mission (OCWM) will go to our new conference while the work of our new association will be supported mainly through individual and congregational support of Friends of the PNEC, which will be renamed as we become an association.
