ORDER OF WORSHIP May 18, 2025 - Fifth Sunday of Easter

CANTATE

In the German Reformed tradition, each Sunday of Easter takes its name in Latin from the first few words of the introit prayer. The introit for the fifth Sunday of Easter is "O Sing unto the Lord a new song, for he hath done marvelous things. The Lord hath made known his salvation; his righteousness hath he openly showed in the sight of the heathen." Cantate loosely translated means 'sing.'
